Highlights Jason Jones, Associational Missionary

Christmas and New Year's has come and gone again. Hopefully special services at your church brought a sweet smelling aroma before the Lord. Also, I am quite convinced that the Lord is pleased with the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering. Most churches that I visited in the last couple of months have met and exceeded their goals. I don't have all the final, concrete numbers in, but I believe we gave over \$250,000 as an association. That is awesome!!! I am really proud to serve an association with a heartbeat for international work enough to sacrifice financially to fund the going forth of the gospel. I spent a week this month at the IMB's missionary learning center, and I know that they are appreciative too. Hopefully churches all across the convention will have ramped up our giving, and possibly reach that \$175 million dollar goal for the first time.

As we get back into the groove for 2016, we must get back into the great commission. After having spent a week with the IMB, I believe that we can do more here. Churches must begin to bear the load personally for sending and shepherding missionaries with the IMB's help, and not the other way around. We must train, and help people transition their lives overseas or to international groups here in the states.

Our methodology (as much as I would like for it to be) should not be to do an associational trip or partnership; it must be done by the local churches. There are several reasons. First, I can't push a trip all over the association. I can train pastors and churches for partnerships and cross-cultural ministry, but if a church and a pastor are not fully committed, it will not work associationally either. Secondly, the logistics of going and fundraising are best handled within the churches. Again, I can train and help, and the IMB will train and help, but the local church is where it rises and falls. Finally, this is biblical. A church may get together with another church to do it, but they work together better, than trying to do a middle man, which we don't see in the scriptures.

So, let this be my push. We need more international, long-term church/IMB/people group partnerships. You can do it. When we began one at New River in 2009, we partnered with a two-year-old church plant of 50 people in Alberta, Canada who agreed to take two trips a year if we took one. It was kind of embarrassing that a church less than half our size, 130 years our junior, would take on 2/3 of the partnership to reach an unreached valley in Peru.

Matt Papa wrote the song on the front of this newsletter that I think sums it up, and asks a very simple question, what's your/churches answer? He doesn't want beliefs or checks; comfort is not a reason to abstain; what are you doing for the nations? If you aren't, commit today. Begin to

advocate, talk to your pastor. Pastor, come talk to me, let me help you in direction toward a partnership to reach a people. What are you waiting for?



TO BE LIKE A CAMEL

There are four characteristics of a camel that bear a remarkable similarity to what is required of a believer.

1. They rely on a master to lead them, and to keep them from wandering aimlessly.

Each day when the camel gets up, it does not know where it will be going, what road lies ahead, or how much burden will be placed on its back. The camel relies on the master to guide it in the proper direction. Without such guidance it would wander aimlessly and get lost.

Christians must depend on the Holy Spirit to guide us each day as we trek down life's highways.

2. They rely on the master to provide them with their daily sustenance.

Since a camel is incapable of providing for its own nourishment, it must rely on the master to provide its needs. The right kinds of food, in the right amounts, at the appropriate times are necessary for the camel to do its job.

We must depend on the Master to "give us our daily bread." (Matthew 6:11)

3. Their eyes are always turned upward as they travel.

When walking, a camel's head is positioned so the eyes are looking forward and upward. There may be occasional glances downward or backward, but these do not last long.

The upward and forward looking position, for Christians, is not a prideful or conceited look; but a simple acceptance of where to look for the ultimate guidance and direction.

4. The knobby knees of a camel are ideally suited for kneeling on a frequent basis.

Frequent kneeling produces the tell-tale knobby pads distinctive of a camel.

Christians should develop callouses kneeling before God in prayer. This posture is absolutely essential for us to be able to rest in the peace that surpasses all understanding.
