I finally got of the hospital after 30 days and am still on the mend, but I am pretty much back at the BCM most of the time. Being with the students and teaching them is the best medicine I could ever have! God has blessed us, and this has been a good year so far. We are preparing to go to our state conference, and we have 38 students going and many of them are freshmen. Our meeting is about LIVING ON MISSION, and I know that many will make decisions this weekend. I always have a 3-week rule. Many students make decisions based on emotions and if that is the case it will fade shortly after they return. But, if their decision was heartfelt and led by God it will stick. Please pray for those who will make true decisions that they will not get distracted in their calling.

We have several in our Guys and Girls small groups this year. In our guy's group we have one with 10 and another with 12. These are the ones who truly want to grow in their faith. As I think about these young men, I pray for them because these are the ones who will be our future leaders. As I observe this group, I see future pastors, deacons, and Sunday school teachers. Churches need more men who will step up and be mentors and leaders so please pray that these young men will grow up to be these mentors and leaders.

It takes lots of time investing in the lives of students for them to grow and learn how to share their faith, how to study the Bible, how to serve the Lord, and how to live in the world and not be of the world. I asked one of the freshmen girls today why she came to so many Bible studies at church and BCM each week and she said, "I am so tempted by the world outside of here and church that I need constant reminding that Jesus is real, and He is Lord." That is so true it seems as if this year many are more than ever bombarded by the world's view on life, and it is hard to know right from wrong. We are studying Galatians and how Paul was confronting those who wanted the Gentiles to become Jews before becoming Christians. These students are confronted with the world around them telling them they can have Jesus and still live like the world. Please pray for them as they fight to stay true to God!

Again, thanks for your prayers for BCM and me. I am still not out of the woods and still have a long way to go, so please continue to pray for my health.
